Junior P.E. Update:





Our theme this year is 'Reading is Magic'




















Careers excursion

As part of our ongoing commitment to the well-being of young people, we feel it is important to address a concerning trend that is affecting young people across the country: vaping.

What is vaping?

Vaping involves inhaling and exhaling the smoke produced by an electronic cigarette or similar device. These devices come in many shapes and sizes, but they all have a battery, a heating element, and a place to hold a liquid.

Why is vaping concerning?

Vapes can have high levels of nicotine and can contain over 200 different chemicals which can be harmful to your lungs and your health. Vaping can make a person breathless and cause persistent coughing. Contrary to claims on packaging, most vapes in Australia contain nicotine which is highly addictive and can harm adolescent brain development affecting attention, learning, mood, and impulse control. Social vaping or doing it occasionally can quickly lead to dependence on nicotine and a desire to vape more often. Vaping can lead to smoking – non-smokers who vape are 3 times more likely to take up smoking cigarette.

What can parents do?

Stay informed: Learn about vaping and its risks from reliable sources such as the Victorian government's resources and the QUIT helpline or contact NDCH.

Talk to your child: Have open and honest conversations about the risks of vaping. Encourage your child to ask questions and share their concerns.

Set a good example: If you smoke or vape, consider quitting. You can reach out to the resources below if you would like more information or support.
