F-6 Bendigo Excursion - I Wish

On Friday the 6th of September, F - 6 students attended a morning live show at the Capital Theatre in Bendigo. *I Wish* was a show featuring gravity-defying acrobatics, stunning visuals, and playful humour. We entered a world of colour and creativity as the performers imagined all the things they could be – from astronauts to unicorns, and everything in between. While exploring their feelings and differences on stage, they reveal the magic of individuality.

People are made of stuff – good stuff and bad stuff, happy and sad stuff, stinky, odd, boring, dangerous, funny, sparkling potions of stuff. People have secret ingredients. We were challenged to consider what our secret ingredient would be?

In the afternoon F-3 students went to the Eaglehawk Playspace which is shaped like a giant eagle hawk, the play space is multi-zoned with both passive and active areas for children to play. It features the famous Banjo Patterson poem Mulga Bill's Bicycle "Twas Mulga Bill from Eaglehawk".

Bus Coordinator Information

Seatbelts- We ask that families remind all students using the bus services to and from school, and on all excursions that you must at all times **wear your seatbelt** on the bus. Students have been continually reminded to do so. There is to be no walking around on the buses while they are moving. All families have signed a Conditions of Travel document when they applied to use the bus system. This states very clearly that if students do not follow driver instructions that they will not be permitted to use the bus. We ask for each family's cooperation in this matter.

Bus Zone- more and more families are using the bus zone to drop students off in the morning while buses are coming in and going out. This is **NOT a good practice** and can lead to dangerous situations. Using the Men's Shed carpark and having students walk across the road through the bus zone is also **NOT good practice**. There have been several situations that could have easily resulted in accidents over the last few weeks from families doing this. We ask that families use the designated drop off and pick up areas for their children at all times.

Former Driver- It is with sadness that we note the recent passing of Darcy Brown, one of our former school bus drivers. Darcy was always helpful and professional in his role, and the kids really enjoyed having him as a driver on the school bus run and on excursions. We send our condolences to his family.

Let's Chat Habitat

On Thursday the 5th of September, Foundation to Year six students attended a live show titled 'Let's Chat Habitat'. The show opened back in prehistoric times with Dina Dinosaur laying an egg which hatches almost immediately. The scene that ensues between mother and baby is hilarious but at the same time shows that size and strength are no guarantee of survival when dealing with nature.

All manner of objects including a giant inflatable earth, signs to aid memory and dark clouds which in the blink of an eye transform into a rainbow. These props are all used to help convey the concepts and ideas dealt with in Let's Chat Habitat

Below are some questions based around the concepts used in the show. The students were asked these questions and they came up with these answers.

Answer: 1989 Exxon Valdez oil spill (15 thousand gallons of oil, 68,200liters)


